Education Award - South Oahu Council for their **Disney- 4-H Exploring Your Environment Day Camp** nutritious pizza snack activity that spanned multiple days from October 6, 8, 9, 2015 and June 9, 14, 29, 2016. FCE members educated the campers on how to create their own delicious pizzas as well as collaborated with UH-Manoa's CTAHR. (FCE volunteer hours = 90) Mahalo for educating our youth!

<u>Action Award</u> - Windward Oahu Council for **Boys and** Girls Club recycle and reuse craft "action" project where 11 FCE members taught youth how to create craft items using recycled/repurposed materials to make gifts for family members. (FCE volunteer hours = 80, donated \$75) FCE and youth in action!

Leadership Award - Hui O Wahine Club, Hilo Council -State project - Dress for Success Hui O Wahine collaborated with Hawaii Community College (HCC) and UH-Hilo's clerical organization, Na Laulima, to collect donated "professional outfits" and accessories that high schoolers and college students could choose from to be interview ready. A Dress for Success brochure was created that offered "tips" on how to look and speak appropriately during an interview. FCE members sorted, ironed, and set up over 500 pieces of clothing and accessories that were offered to students at HCC and UH-Hilo. An FCE member also did an hour presentation at Pahoa High School to 25 students on how to dress for a successful interview and students then selected attire from our "closet". (FCE volunteer hours = 270.5, donated \$1,244.76) Leadership for youth!

International Programs


