Joan Yoshino's Ono Cone Sushi

4 cups rice
3⁄4 c. sugar
3⁄4 c. vinegar
2 teaspoons salt
Heat sugar and salt in vinegar to dissolve sugar. Mix gently into rice.

Carrots – slivered, and cooked in ½ cup sugar, ¼ cup water, 4 dried shrimp (can substitute ½ pkgdashi no moto), ½ cup sugar. Cool. Gently mix the seasoned carrots into vinegar rice.

Microwave 2 minutes to warm seasoned aburage (tofu pockets). Stuff sushi carrot rice mixture into pockets. MSG free pockets can be bought from Marukai.







During Spring Break, the story Musubi Man will be read to the children at the Boys and Girls Club. Then, the children will make mini spam musubis. (This idea was Pat Kubo's.) To practice, Emily Deai brought rice filled snack bags, seasoned mini spam and nori. We had an excellent (and fun) practice session. Plus, we got to eat the musubis and the ono cone sushis.
