Betty Jo Thompson

Betty Jo (Hubbard) Thompson came to Hawaii in 1953 from Oklahoma on her way around the world and ended up staying a lifetime. She worked as an Extension Home Economist in Hilo until 1955, returned to CES in 1964 and retired in 1994 with 32 years of service. In between, Betty Jo was a Home Service Consultant for Hawaii Electric Light Co. in Hilo and Hawaiian Electric Co. on Oahu. Betty Jo taught 4-H youth and University Extension homemakers (now Family and Community Education program) in leadership development, volunteer management, and family resource management. She was very instrumental in developing healthy recipes and promoting local fruits like papaya, pineapple, and guava, and a pioneer in using media (newspaper, radio, video and TV) to reach more audiences. As an Extension agent on the Big Island, her spacious home was always open and welcoming for use of meetings, demonstrations, and warm informal gatherings. She was a mentor to many and friend to all. Betty Jo was a lifelong learner and consummate teacher, sharing her knowledge and skills and helping people take control of their lives. Betty Jo was recently living in PA and is survived by her two daughters Veda and Mari Jo and two grandsons. She died 11/17/2017 at 86 years old. Submitted by CES, with contributions by D. Smith

We would like to welcome these four new members from Hilo and one from South Oahu ~

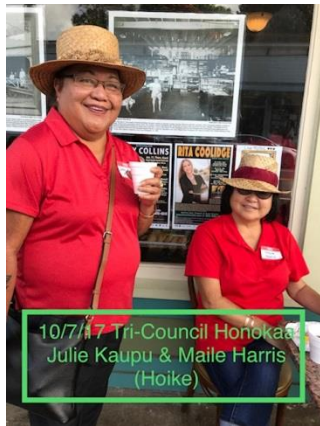

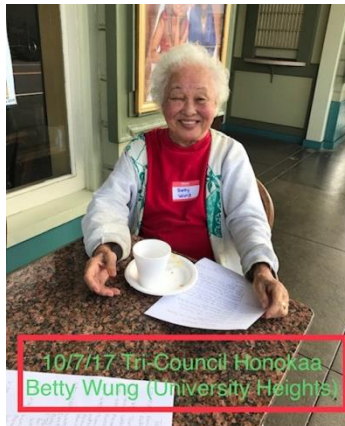


Hamakua FCE Council – Submitted by Lori Kashiwa

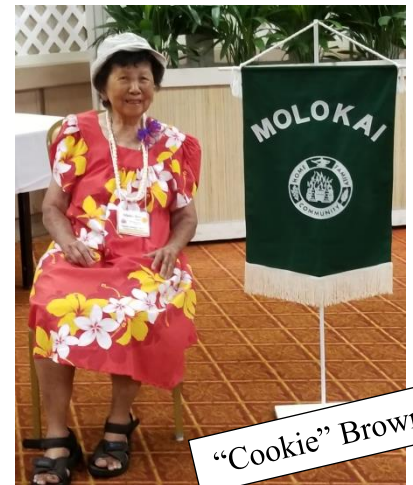
