KAFCE Donates 111 Grooming Kits to YWCA's Womens Shelter!

Kauai YWCA's Women's Shelter exists to help individuals escape abusive situations and who are unable to find shelter elsewhere. The challenges faced by a person fleeing from domestic violence or sexual assault are many. The goal of the shelter is to get them to somewhere SAFE.

Per Laura DiTroia, Asst Director of Kauai's Women's Shelter, "The shelter serviced 135 individuals in fiscal year July-June 2018; 60 of which were children." KAFCE's grooming kits become part of a welcome package for those seeking shelter. Other companies, individuals, and grants contribute: linens, towels, clothing, toys, food, etc. making a shelter stay as comfortable as possible. A team of specialists are assigned, as needed, to work with both parent and child(ren).



When families exit the shelter, Laura mentioned a need for house warming kits consisting of cleaning supplies, toilet paper, etc. Another wish list item for center occupants was gas and/or gift cards. **Thank you** KAFCE members for contributing your time, funds, and supplies in support of this service activity!

Education is a key component to prevention. Laura says, "The YWCA offers an Alternative To Violence (ATV) Program in the community and schools. The YWCA teach K-12 students about safe dating, safe habits, safe touching, staying safe, asking for consent, and relationships."

We became aware at our "International Day" which featured Italy that several regions and people of different cultures make up Italy.

We learned about Naples, an important and unique part of Italy, from guest speaker Nazira De Marchi, who pointed out that Neopolitan culture is different from that of people of northern Italy which is more Germanic. Naples, located on the southwest coast of Italy (close to the toe of the "boot") has been historically involved in war and trade with countries and empires in the region.



Food is an important part of a culture and in Naples pizza is made in a wood-fired oven. Nazira makes her own pasta. Questions of where to buy "real" bread and cheese locally were asked. She recommended Midnight Bear Bakery for breads and Costco for mozzarella and parmesan cheese.

Families eat meals together and Nazira noted that no child was asked what they wanted for dinner; everyone ate what was served. In Italy, wine, cheese, and pasta form an integral part of the meal.
